COURSE DESCRIPTION

This two-day practical course aims to cover the general principles of lameness examination and how to assess lame horses systematically and successfully. This course is suitable for veterinarians from mixed or equine practice who are keen to establish the foundations of lameness investigation through lectures and extensive practical sessions in small groups.

In the mornings the following highly-illustrated lectures will be covered by experts in the field in **English and with translation into Hungarian**:

- History taking
- Clinical Presentation of Common Pathologies
- A Systematic Approach to Lameness Examination
- Decision Making – Anaesthetic Techniques versus Imaging
- Diagnostic Anaesthesia – Regional & Intra-synovial Techniques
- Ultrasonography – When and how to use it in lameness cases
- Radiography – When and how to use it in lameness cases
- Common Conditions of the distal Frontlimb
- Common Conditions of the Hindlimb

In the afternoons, two **3½-hour practical sessions** will give delegates plenty of opportunity to put theory into practice on lame horses and limb specimens (diagnostic anaesthetic techniques) and to ask questions in **small groups (3 – 5 people per group)**, all under the supervision of specialists. Each delegate will be rotating through the following practical sessions:

- History Taking & Practical Lameness Examination
- Musculoskeletal Palpation – which anatomical structures can be palpated?
- Regional & Intra-synovial Injection Techniques on equine limbs
- Sound Horses – Pre-purchase Examination
- Lame Horses – How to approach this case?

The course fee includes lunches at a restaurant, coffee/tea breaks, extensive course notes and a certificate of attendance. Delegates can choose to only attend the lectures (= Lectures Only) on this course or can register for the entire course (= Lectures & Practical Sessions). On the evening of the first day all delegates are invited to attend the course dinner, which costs 5,000 HUF (not included in the course fee; drinks will be charged extra). Early course registration via the VetPD website www.vetpd.com is recommended as there are only a limited number of places available.

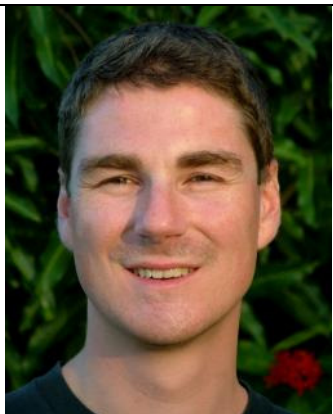

Having qualified at the University of Cambridge in 1968, John first worked in agricultural and mixed practices in West Wales and Bodmin Moor before practising for 5 years in Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. He returned in 1976 to set up the Liphook Practice. John's post-graduate qualifications are in orthopaedic surgery and in general equine surgery. He is a Diplomate of the European College of Veterinary Surgeons, of which he is a Past President and was awarded an honorary fellowship of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons in 2004. John has lectured worldwide and has published papers in both refereed journals and text books. His particular interest is in equine surgery and lameness problems. John has been a member of the Council of the British Equine Veterinary Association and the Veterinary Advisory Committee to the HBLB and is now a member of the Council of the RVC. Since retiring from practice he has been a visiting fellow in equine surgery at the University of Melbourne (Australia) and a visiting professor at the Swedish Veterinary School (Uppsala).

John took fantastic 2-day lameness courses for equine specialists in Hungary in 2005 and 2007. He will be one of the speakers of the 13th WEVA Congress in Budapest in 3rd – 5th of October 2013.

Emmanuel qualified from the University of Bern, Switzerland in 1998 and went on to perform a Large Animal Internship at the University of Minnesota, USA followed by a Large Animal Surgery Residency (surgical specialisation) at Cornell University in New York. He became a Diplomate of the American and European College of Veterinary Surgeons in 2004.

Following his residency he worked as an equine surgeon in private practice in New York and Switzerland before accepting the position as Head of the Orthopaedic Department at the Bell Equine Veterinary Clinic in Kent, England in 2005. In March 2009 he was appointed Head of the Equine Hospital and University Equine Surgeon at The Queen's Veterinary School Hospital of the University of Cambridge. Emmanuel is now working as a Consultant for Equine Orthopaedics for private equine clinics in East Anglia and the Southeast of England with a focus on lameness and performance diagnostics/therapeutics and orthopaedic surgery. Emmanuel has published several clinical articles in peer-reviewed veterinary journals and lectures regularly at national and international courses/conferences on equine orthopaedics.

Luis qualified from the Faculdade de Medicina Veterinária in Lisbon, Portugal in 2001. Following an externship at the University of California Davis he spent two years in private practice in Évora, Portugal. In 2003 he completed an internship in Equine Studies at the University of Cambridge, followed by a residency in Large Animal Surgery at the same institution. Following completion of his surgical training, Luis has worked in an equine referral practice in York and as a surgeon at the University of Cambridge. He is a Diplomate of the European College of Veterinary Surgeons and has been awarded the Certificate in Equine Orthopaedic Surgery by the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (RCVS). He has published several clinical articles in peer-review journals and is the author of three book chapters in equine diagnostics and surgery reference books.

Currently he is undertaking a PhD and studies modelling of musculoskeletal ontogenic development at the Royal Veterinary College and Imperial College in London. He is a regular speaker at courses run by the British Equine Veterinary Association (BEVA) on topics pertaining to lameness diagnostics and treatment.
